

AUGUST GOEDEN HISTORY

The following are excerpts from Sylvia and Viola's writing on the families.

Our great, great, great grand father Peter Goeden was the oldest known to trace. The Goeden's came from three villages near Trier on the Moselle River, which separated Germany from Luxembourg. They were all farmers in that area. Four generations of Goeden's were named Peter. Peter, the first generation was probably born around 1732 near the town of Kell. The Goeden name was spelled Goden with a German umlaut above the "o". This in German gave it the "a" sound. The English alphabet did not have umlauts so they wrote oe and in German when 2 vowels appear in a word the last is pronounced and in German the e is said with an "a" sound.

Peter Goeden and his wife Margareth Schoemer Goeden, residents of Lorscheid immigrated to the U. S. in June 1846. With them were 6 children. Michael, 14 years and the oldest, was to become my grandfather. James Polk was president of the U. S. and Wisconsin had not yet become a State of the Union. At that time Wisconsin had fewer then 6 people per square mile and their trip from New York took 4 weeks by rail.

The family arrived in Milwaukee, and then proceeded by oxcart to a town called Kewaskum. They spent the first winter with friends who had preceded them from Germany. On the land they built a log cabin and also a log church, which later was replaced with a fieldstone church and still stands there today.

Several years later, Peter acquired four parcels of wooded land along the Milwaukee River near Myra. The land was cleared and divided among his sons. The present farm about 5 miles S. E. of West Bend was the homestead. Margareth Schoemer Goeden is buried at St. Peter's church near West Bend. Her husband, Peter and their children and some of the grandchildren are buried in the Catholic cemetery in Newburg, Wisconsin.

Our grandfather Michael married a woman by the name of Ermina. They settled on a farm south of Newburg. They had 18 children, of which our dad (August) was the 16th.

Our grandfather acquired another farm, but died soon afterward. His wife Ermina used to walk all the way to Pt. Washington for groceries like flour, sugar etc. She would also walk to Milwaukee to buy material for sewing. It would take her several days and she would sleep in fields on the way carrying her purchases on her back. There were usually robbers along the way usually dressed as women and would ask for rides on wagons and then they would rob the people. She sold both farms and moved to Pt. Washington.

August went to a country school where only German was spoken. When they moved to Pt. Washington he attended a Catholic school. He ran away when he was 13 or 14 years old because he accidentally hit a nun in the face with a snow-ball and was afraid of getting beaten by the Priest who was very mean. He went to Michigan and worked in a harness-blacksmith shop. He traveled around the U.S. by riding box cars and freight trains. He worked along the way learning several trades. He also shot wolves for bounty money. He was hired by a company to protect their claims and was told to shoot anyone who was going to jump their claims. He left that job and worked on a big ranch called the C. R. Here is where he met our mother Mary Edith. She lived with her parents on their claim nearby at Hat Creek. Wyoming.

August married Mary Edith Rice on October 18, 1911. They lived with her parents. They took jobs at Moorecraft, Wyoming for a large rancher. Father, breaking and training horses while mother worked in the house as a cook. Father took out a claim and built a one room log cabin. He also built the furniture. They had no well, and water was gotten from a nearby creek. They bought some cattle, horses, and chickens. He worked wherever he could find employment. They lived about 1 mile from our grandparents and 2 miles from the store and post office. Lusk, the nearest town was about 18 or 20 miles away.

One day they saddled up their horses and rode to Cheyenne about 75 miles to a rodeo. It took them several days there and back and slept in fields along the way.

For a time father worked for a sheep rancher and was gone several months at a time. He lived in a sheep herder's wagon, did his own cooking and baking. He had trained sheep dogs to help take the sheep to summer pasture and guard them against wolves and coyotes. He passed the time by whittling, collecting Indian beads from old Indian camps, arrowheads and rattle snake rattles. He also found petrified shells and even a large turtle shell.

When he was home he built another room on to the cabin and put a wooden floor in it. Augie, Sylvia, Vernon, Orville and Viola were born there. It was very hard for mother to raise a family, carry water, and feed the animals by herself while father was away. She had a rifle to protect herself from coyotes and wolves. She had a garden and canned all produce for winter use. In winter ice had to be broken on the creek before they could get water. One day she saw a shinny object in the bank by the creek. She dug it out discovering soldier's buttons and an old uniform partly rotted. Probably a soldier was buried there after an Indian battle. There was also a stage station near their ranch and ran from Cheyenne to Deadwood, S. D. It was discontinued a few years before they arrived.

August and Mary Edith went back to Wisconsin to visit his family. They sold their 1000 acres in 1920, bought a 1918 Dort (a big touring car) a tent for camping and headed for Wisconsin. They drove across country as there were no roads and at times had to cut fences and mend them after they passed through. In Nebraska, the cars radiator broke down causing them to stay there 3 weeks for repairs. They next drove to Kansas to visit Mary Edith's sister and then on to Illinois, where they encountered the first well graveled roads. This must have been a rough trip traveling with 5 children, the oldest being 8 years and the youngest 3 months.

They arrived in Grafton and rented a house without electricity, but it had a pump for water. Erv and Virginia were born there. Much sickness entered in with Viola and Augie having diphtheria, while Vernon and Sylvia had scarlet fever. Mother had to take care of us alone as father was quarantined in the front room so he could get to work.

Virginia died there of pneumonia shortly after she was 2 years old.

They next moved to Cedarburg, into an old stone farm house. The canning factory owned the land and farmed it. The house was in bad shape without electricity as it had been used for storing grain. The upstairs windows were broken, rat holes in the floor and bed bugs from pigeons living in the house. It took a lot of cleaning and patching up, but rent was only \$5.00 a month. They took care of the canning factories horses. They also had a garden, orchard, a cow, chickens, ducks, turkeys, and geese. Mother did her usual canning while carrots, potatoes and apples were put in the basement for winter. Milk, butter and cheese were also kept cool in a box on the dirt floor in the basement. There was no ice box for storage. Mother had an old wooden washing machine that was operated by hand which was easier than scrubbing by hand on a wash board.

One day Augie and Vernon were playing in the attic where they found father's gun, a rifle. It was loaded with bird shot for chasing stray dogs away. They didn't know it was loaded and Augie shot Vernon square in the face. They came screaming down the stairs blood running all over Vernon. Mom sent the older children to fetch father and the doctor while she did what she could to calm the boys and stop the bleeding. The doctor came daily and placed boric acid packs on Vernon's face to draw out the BB's. His face healed and was lucky he wasn't blinded. All of his life BB's kept coming out, either the corners of his eyes or mouth, and his face always looked like he had blue freckles under his skin. Vernon also had pneumonia there and another bout of scarlet fever kept the family in quarantine.

In this house Kenneth and Armand were born. Their were nine children all together.

August was a carpenter and managed pretty well until the depression. Some relief was given thru the government with stamps for food and clothes. Mary Edith made pillows from the down of the geese and ducks and father stuffed our mattresses with straw. Mother's favorite saying was "Use it up, wear it out, and make it do, or do without." Our father worked for the W. P. A. This was started by the government for needy people. Orville and Vernon signed up for the C. C. C.'s a government program for young men working on roads, and parks. Their food and clothing were furnished plus \$30.00 of which \$25.00 was sent to their parents leaving them with \$5.00. They helped build Grant Park in South Milwaukee.

From ox carts and covered wagons, to modern day cars and big jets. From sod shanties with dirt floors and oiled-paper windows to air conditioned homes and microwave ovens. From working in the fields and growing your own crops, or taking for granite that you can go to the grocery stores and pick things off of the shelves. There have been many changes in the last century and our parents have seen many of them, and I'm sure there will be many more changes to come. They have lived through the depression and learned the value of a dime. It would be nice if YOU could record your lives for Your future generations.

Remember, we are only here on earth for a certain number of days. Value each day as it was your last, tell the person you are with that you love them each and every day, never go to bed mad at each other, if you are still one of the fortunate ones that still have their parents, when was the last time that you gave them a hug, kiss or told them that you love them. Parents, when was the last time that you gave your children a hug or a kiss. Here today, gone tomorrow means just that. Value your life with those around you.

I hope that you have enjoyed the book so far.
